





"The world will never be won to Christ with what people can conveniently spare" - Bernard Edinger

Our giving should reflect not only our willingness to give but also our ability to give and since individual circumstances differ significantly, so will our individual gifts. A starting point when reflecting on our Christian giving is what should we give in common with the whole community – sharing the responsibility and task together. The initial target suggestion of other Christian tithing denominations would be 5-10% of post-tax income. We in the Catholic Church do not directly suggest tithing, but all denominations have similar running costs.






