




Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!

## A story from the persecuted church in China about a lay missionary 's visit there

On the second night of his visit, he was awoken in the middle of the night by the noise of people moving around the house. A little scared, he got up out of bed and went to his door. Opening his door he grabbed one of the men living in the house and said to him "what is going on?" The Chinese man replied "we're going to the wall". He inquired further "What is the wall?" The Chinese man replied "Come with us and we will show you" He got dressed and ventured out into the night with this group of people, walking for miles. On the way they were joined by two other groups until they numbered about 120 people. They came to a forest and he noticed that some of the male members were climbing up the trees. (it turns out that they were look-outs). They got to a clearing in the forest and there was a small half-built wall from an old derelict building. As they came closer, everyone fell down on their knees before the wall.

Moments later, one man got up and walked towards the wall and reaching forwards removed one brick, behind the brick was reserved the Blessed Sacrament. They adored the Blessed Sacrament for one hour in silent prayer. Then the brick was replaced, the men came down from the trees and they went home. Two or three times a week they would go to the wall in the middle of the night, risking imprisonment or even their lives, to spend an hour with Jesus, their greatest friend.

We are to be Resurrection people - Easter, the feast of the Resurrection, gives us the joyful message that we are a "Resurrection people." This means that we are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of our sins, evil habits, and dangerous addictions. It gives us the Good News that no tomb can hold us down anymore - not the tomb of despair, discouragement, doubt or death itself. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the real presence of the Risen Lord in all the events of our lives. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24).

Making this your most rewarding Easter ever! - Recognizing the days leading up to Easter prepares your heart and mind to fully appreciate the most important aspect of the holiday: The Resurrection! For in the Resurrection of Jesus we find our hope of eternal life (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18). This event in the life of the early disciples changed everything. Before the Resurrection, they were cowering behind closed doors – hiding out in fear—but after the Resurrection, their faith was renewed and strengthened. The Resurrection of Jesus was given to us as proof for the Gospel (Good News) (Acts 17:31b). Build your faith in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ just as the early church did.

**Priesthood** - Don't ever tire of praying for priests, especially in these times in which it seems that all the powers of evil have descended on the earth, preying particularly upon the sacred ministries of the Lord. Pray that they remain faithful, that they be holy, that they be, in short, nothing more (and nothing less) than what they ought to be: Alter Christus. The Sacred Heart linking Christ to priests is a popular symbol of the priesthood. In the rite of ordination the phrase "Alter Christus" ("another Christ") reminds us that, although Christ himself is present to his Church, the priest acts as "another Christ" by virtue of his ordination.
