Message from Fr Hugh...

Last week a major change took place in the U.S. Supreme Court when judges reversed the *Roe v Wade* judgement of nearly 50 years ago. Media interviews were incessant for a few days. Here is part of the statement issued in England.

Bishop John Sherrington in London (Bishop for Life Issues)

“The recent decision of the US Supreme Court to overturn the *Roe v Wade* judgement and so affirm that the constitution does not confer a right to abortion is momentous and of huge significance. It reflects the work and commitment of those who seek to protect women who are pregnant and the unborn child. Pope Francis reminds us of how abortion laws have trivialised the gift of human life, “It is troubling to see how simple and convenient it has become for some to deny the existence of a human life as a solution to problems that can and must be solved for both the mother and her unborn child.” (Pope Francis to UN, September 2020.)

The judgement not only calls for reflection in the US, but also for significant reflection in our country as we see again the rising numbers of abortions in 2021. The many painful situations which lead to abortion are reflected in these shocking statistics and call for better legal and social protections for women and the unborn child. They call for much more reflection on what is needed for relationships and sex education that is rooted in respect and self-restraint, support for the family and single mothers. We need to reduce the upper time limit for abortions and re-examine the law which permits a child with disability to be aborted up to birth. This is a moment that calls for the building of a culture of life and welcome where all are recognised and treated as a gift. This is the work of the evangelisation of culture. The Church will strive to offer hope and healing for all those hurt by the tragedy of abortion.”
