Message from Fr Hugh...

Padley Sunday is celebrated this Sunday, As previously mentioned, we gather at 3pm at Grindleford Station and take the short walk to Padley chapel where Mass will be celebrated at 3.30pm. If you have already attended Mass, you are free to receive Holy Communion again – it won't do us any harm!! Bishop John Arnold of Salford and from Sheffield will be the preacher. He visited Hassop a few months ago when the choir were gathered on a Tuesday afternoon ... they didn't know it was Bishop John. Tom and Monica know him from years ago and knew his parents. On their Golden Wedding anniversary, Bishop John sent them a card (not offering any annulment!!) and later on invited them to a meal in Bishop's House – but they had to go out to eat! It would be wonderful if we made that *extra effort* to attend the Mass. I hope to be there to express a prayer of thanksgiving for our heroic forebears in the pilgrimage of faith and love right to their very last breath.

Sea Sunday is the mission outreach of the local diocese to seafarers. In years gone by every city or town with a functioning port had a branch of the Apostleship of the Sea. It is now also called *Stella Maris*, (Star of the Sea) a title given to Our Lady. There is a 2nd collection for this work this weekend: it reminds us of how important on the sea is and of those who work there. These days the work of port chaplains is carried out by deacons and lay chaplains. It is wonderful to think that seafarers are still being supported through this apostolate.

Next Sunday Benjamin and Martha will make their First Holy Communion. They have already celebrated their First Reconciliation. Some parishioners remember when we had 6, 7 or 8 for this celebration but, in my years here, numbers have been smaller with perhaps 4, 5 or 6 in the group. Our Parish Catechists and the parents have devoted much time to preparation on Sunday mornings – many thanks for this work..
