Message from Fr Hugh...

**P A C E S** the school which Aoife attends, has written a beautiful 'thank you' card to all who supported Aoife's fundraising through the special collection in Lent and the Lent Jars. Aoife is described as an ambassador for fundraising so be on your guard!

**Last Sunday** we had a very full church with lots of visitors and more than our usual number of young people with us. It was the feast of Pentecost, sometimes called the "birth of the church" (cf Preface) because of the many languages and people moved by that first Pentecost gathering in Jerusalem. It was the day when the Easter season came to a close and in this past week we returned to the daily Mass and Divine Office for the season of Ordinary Time. As we go through the summer season, we'll celebrate many important feasts in the prayer of the Church beginning with this weekend when the feast of the Holy Trinity is celebrated.

Other important feasts in June are *Corpus Christi* (19<sup>th</sup>), *Birth of St John the Baptist* (23<sup>rd</sup>), *the Sacred Heart of Jesus* (24<sup>th</sup>) and *SS Peter & Paul* (29<sup>th</sup> a Holy Day for us). **There was a time some years ago** when I didn't pay too much attention to the in-depth content of liturgical celebrations and words: I offered the Masses and prayed the Prayer of the Church but the *inner meaning* didn't really strike me too much. Then I began to read a little bit more about the liturgy, its history, the words used, the gestures made with and to the congregation and I began to get a bit more from what is actually done when people come together in prayer, especially at the Sunday Eucharist. I find many of the words are quite inspirational. For example, last Sunday's collect, "fill now once more *the hearts* of believers..." or "Almighty God, deign to restore once more *joy in the hearts* of your faithful people..." There is an old expression that says something like "how we pray leads us to how we shall profess our faith" [lex orandi, lex credendi]. Maybe, just maybe, some of us will make that extra special effort to journey with the liturgy and the memory of the saints during our summer months and the Eucharist remains the best way for doing this.

**And on the earthly side of things:** a new oil tank was put in place this past week. Thanks to Bill who supervised and organised it for the parish community. Twice during the winter 2 drivers refused to discharge the oil ordered because they maintained the old tank was a liability. Luckily there were no crises during the winter but something had to be done to avoid any such crisis. And for the folks interested in prices (and we have a few!), it cost £3,000.00. Don't think parish fairs are over yet! **Fr Hugh**
