Message from Fr Hugh...

In a letter to the whole diocese Bishop Patrick used three key words that have remained with me since I read that letter about four years ago now. The key words were *encounter*, *discipleship* and *missionary discipleship*. Last year when Pope Francis launched the *Synod* it was for the whole Church. What a job to try to do –getting the *whole Church* to pray, to talk, to think, to act, to imagine, to dream, to meet, to discuss and all the rest along the Synodal path. Pope Francis is courageous if nothing else but he is also a prophet for our times, I think. Three key words were chosen to guide the Synod on its journey viz. *communion*, *participation* and *mission*. Some people, of course, sit back and say “it’s just words” and, if it was just words, it would indeed be very sad. These key words from both Bishop Patrick and the Synod organisers can be words that incentivise people as well. If, for example, the word *discipleship* has not in any way moved us to self-question, then it will be just a word. If the word prompts us (me) to ponder “How am I doing?” in the light of this invitation, this call, that’s a good thing. Each of those six words could be taken and pondered and, hopefully, we would not be saying, “it’s just words”. At our quiet weekday Masses we usually have the Synod Prayer: it is not the kind of prayer I would compose because I don’t particularly like long prayers! But I have become more familiar with it now and little phrases do strike me, for example: “*Holy Spirit we gather together in your name... make Yourself at home in our hearts... Let us find in You our unity...*” The work of the Synod is still ongoing as are those six key words.

Many thanks to those parishioners who managed to make it to Padley last Sunday. It was a very *hot* afternoon but 8 or 9 of us withstood that heat and survived it all. Bishop John Arnold, the homilist, made a brief reference to the Padley martyrs but then he went on to develop the prayer of Cardinal Newman on God’s “mission” for each person. **Thanks** also for those who have attended recent meetings viz. finance and PPC. A few more meetings are planned viz. liturgy, church wardens + Eucharistic ministers and the parish accounts will be audited for the last time by Tim Harding. All being well, everything will be a little bit “tidy” for the end of July – except for my room! **Fr Hugh**
