Message from Fr Hugh...

Morning Mass will be celebrated on Monday at 10am and on Tuesday at 9.15am. These will be our normal quiet celebrations but they are not private. On Tuesday Ash and I will carry personal items to Chester and I will stay there ... but poor Ash has to make the journey back alone!

This is my personal moment to express my thanks to you all. I have been with you now just over 16 years: it has been the longest appointment I have ever had. I was asked to consider a CSSp London parish a few years ago but I put my ace card out and said something like, "A London parish at my age and in my state of health and after Hassop..." The Provincial obviously took fright and never mentioned it again and I am very glad he didn't. I have loved serving the community even the family & friends of our parish and I am most thankful to the Lord that I have been able to continue with it up to the 50th anniversary of the Spiritan presence in the parish. That beautiful Sunday at the end of May and the little plaque on the new room will remind us of this 50 year connection with Hassop and Bakewell even if our memories begin to fade away. Our recent BBQ was a wonderful morning together: it has left me with a warm feeling whenever I remember it and it showed how the bond between the parish and the Spiritans has been forged and strengthened during those years. Thank you all so very much.

Often when a priest leaves a parish it provides a moment to express any regrets that may have hurt people over the years. This certainly has happened in Hassop & Bakewell and I take this moment to offer my apologies for any hurt that I may have caused and, for my part, I can say that there are no hard feelings in my heart. The message of Jesus Christ is one of peace and reconciliation: these are values even "graces" that our world needs today and at all times. We, too, need the same graces as disciples of Jesus. No disciple should be unforgiving and we all should seek that disposition of heart which is reflected in the motto of the Holy Ghost Frs viz. "Cor unum et Anima una", which is "One Heart and one Soul (Spirit)".

As from next Sunday the services will be those mentioned in the Emmaus Hub so Fr Robbie will be with you for the 9.00am Mass in Hassop. The newsletter will be for both parishes and I'd like to thank Sarah for keeping our own weekly bulletin together week after week – thank you, Sarah!
