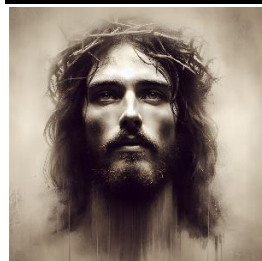

Care Pods will be organised around preferred Mass times, and it is our desire that every person and family who attends church will sign up to be a member of a Care Pod. The expectation is that as small groups we can pray for each other, meet small needs, support a significant event, perhaps an offer a lift to Mass if needed, and to remember and celebrate each other's special days. The world in which we live has become isolated for many, especially since Covid. We must support each other and nurture community. There will be a form handed out next weekend where Care Pods can start to be created. The Care Pod can be as you wish to make it, and maybe it not for everyone – but it may help us all to move towards a better understanding of Missionary Discipleship.

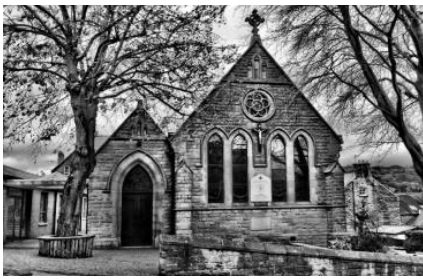
